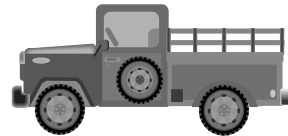


Message From The Board



Summer greetings everyone! We want to welcome a new board member, Louis Lindgren, who will be our corresponding secretary. Louise has volunteered countless hours to the MCPA for many years. We look forward to her continuing expertise and guidance. Some of you may have already received a welcome letter for renewing your membership. These letters come from Louise.

At our next work party we will try to have a 4 x 4 on the other side of the river at Twin Bridges for members to ride in to the Town site and work there. If, however, the weather is wet, we will, instead, finish brushing the Barlow Cut trail toward the bottom end by the highway. We have received a hydraulic permit for crossing the river one time only at each work party through the 22nd of August. Please remember, motorized vehicles require a hydraulic permit to cross the river and this is extremely hard to obtain from the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Any other people who wish to cross the river with motorized vehicles must, separately, apply for and obtain this same permit for themselves. And finally, please remember to use your new, red decals this year when driving in past the gate. It helps us identify the MCPA members.



For any members interested in volunteering on their own time, eg. Sundays or not during one of our work parties, please contact me.

Remember we welcome members to attend our board meetings. The next one will be Monday, August 9, in Mountlake Terrace. Please email me if you are interested in attending and I can give you directions. The meetings usually last 1 ½ hours.

The MCPA remains in contact with the Forest Service regarding any updated information on the planned Hazmat cleanup. As far as we know, they still plan on putting in a new road to access the area for heavy equipment sometime next year, in 2011. In the meantime, the Forest Service Town Site Host Program and our continuing maintenance of the old County road are unchanged as we continue to help monitor and preserve the area.
